## PE Days:

This term we will have PE on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons.

We would like your child to have their clearly named P.E kits (t-shirt, dark coloured shorts, suitable footwear and tracksuit bottoms for colder weather) in school daily. We will continue to run the daily mile each day, please could you ensure that your child has a set of trainers in school.
